## Unconventional Oil from California's Monterey Formation- Exploitation Results

There is a heightened interest in the future exploitation and redevelopment of the California Monterey formation as a source of unconventional oil reserves. During the past five years, major and independent oil companies have invested many millions of dollars gathering 3D seismic data and drilling over a hundred horizontal and vertical wells, many hydraulically fractured, to find the location of and key technologies to producing significant economic quantities of crude oil and natural gas from intervals within the Monterey shale. This paper presents the results to-date of the renewed recent industry drilling campaign to unlock unconventional oil reserves from the Monterey. In large part relying on public records, this paper presents the drilling, Initial Production, production decline rates, well spacing, gas-oil ratio behavior and estimated reserves results for the Monterey drilling activity during the past 5 - 6 years (2007 - 2012) in the San Joaquin Valley, California. Results will show wells that are highly variable in terms of oil IP and gas-oil ratios. An analysis of typical single well economics will be presented based on these data. Key fields include the Rose, North Shafter, Asphalto, Railroad Gap, Buena Vista and Monument Junction fields. The production and reserves statistics are useful and informative to those interested in the progress and successful exploitation of the Monterey.
