

Dr. Lee's presentation is titled: Are All Those Bad Things They're Saying About Our Production Forecasts in Unconventionals True?

Abstract: Amid the recent slump in E&P stocks, there have been a number of articles about tight oil forecasts. Everyone from individuals on LinkedIn to Wood Mackenzie and the Wall Street Journal have been weighing in on the quality of what are essentially reservoir engineering analyses. What is the reality? Do we know enough about these reservoirs to predict 5-year performance, much less 30-year performance? Dr. Lee will give an overview of both the truths and fictions behind those critiques.



Bio: John Lee is Professor of Petroleum Engineering at Texas A&M University. John holds BS, MS and PhD degrees in chemical engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology. He worked for ExxonMobil early in his career and specialized in integrated reservoir studies. He later joined the Petroleum Engineering faculty at Texas A&M, and became Regents Professor of Petroleum Engineering. While at A&M, he also served as a consultant with S.A. Holditch &

Associates, where he specialized in reservoir engineering aspects of unconventional gas resources. He joined the University of Houston faculty in September 2011 and held the Cullen Distinguished University Chair until September 2015. He served as an Academic Engineering Fellow with the U.S. Securities & Exchange Commission (SEC) in Washington during 2007-8, and was a principal architect of the modernized SEC rules for reporting oil and gas reserves. John is the author of four textbooks published by SPE and has received numerous awards from SPE, including the Lucas Medal, the DeGolyer Distinguished Service Medal and Honorary Membership. He is a member of the U.S. National Academy of Engineering and the Russian Academy of Natural Sciences.
